PART I

Instructions: The first segment there are several statements or questions with two alternative answers. Indicate your personal preferences by writing the numbers within the boxes of each question. Some of the alternatives may seem equally attractive or unpleasant. However, always choose one of them even if they are very slightly different. In each question, you have 3 points that you can distribute in any of the following combinations:

- If you agree with alternative (a) and disagree with (b), enter 3 in the first box and 0 in the second, like this:

a	3
b	0

- If you agree with alternative (b) and disagree with (a), write:

a	0
b	3

- If you have a slight preference for (a) instead of (b), write:

a	2
b	1

- If you have a slight preference for (b) instead of (a), write:

a	1
b	2

Don't write any combination of numbers other than one of these four. There is no time limit, but do not delay too much in any question or statement. Don't leave any of the questions unanswered, unless you really cannot make a decision.

PART II

Instructions: Each of the following situations or questions is followed by four possible attitudes or responses. Classify these answers in the order of your personal preference by entering in the corresponding box on the answer sheet a score of 4, 3, 2 or 1. To the statement of your preference, write down a 4, whichever you find second most preferred, write a 3, and so on. Example: If there were a question here and the following statements were alternatives to classify them in order of preference, you would write a:

- 4 in the box, if this statement seems the most appealing
- 3 in the box, if this statement interested you in the second place
- 2 in the box, if this statement appealed to you in the third place
- 1 in the box, if this affirmation is the one that represents your least interest or preference

You may come up with answers that, from your point of view, would be better suited instead of those presented to you; However, you must select among the alternatives presented and classify the four in order of their preference, even if sometimes it's difficult to choose among them. If it's really impossible for you to express your preference, you can omit the question. Be sure to assign only a 4, a 3, etc., for each question.
